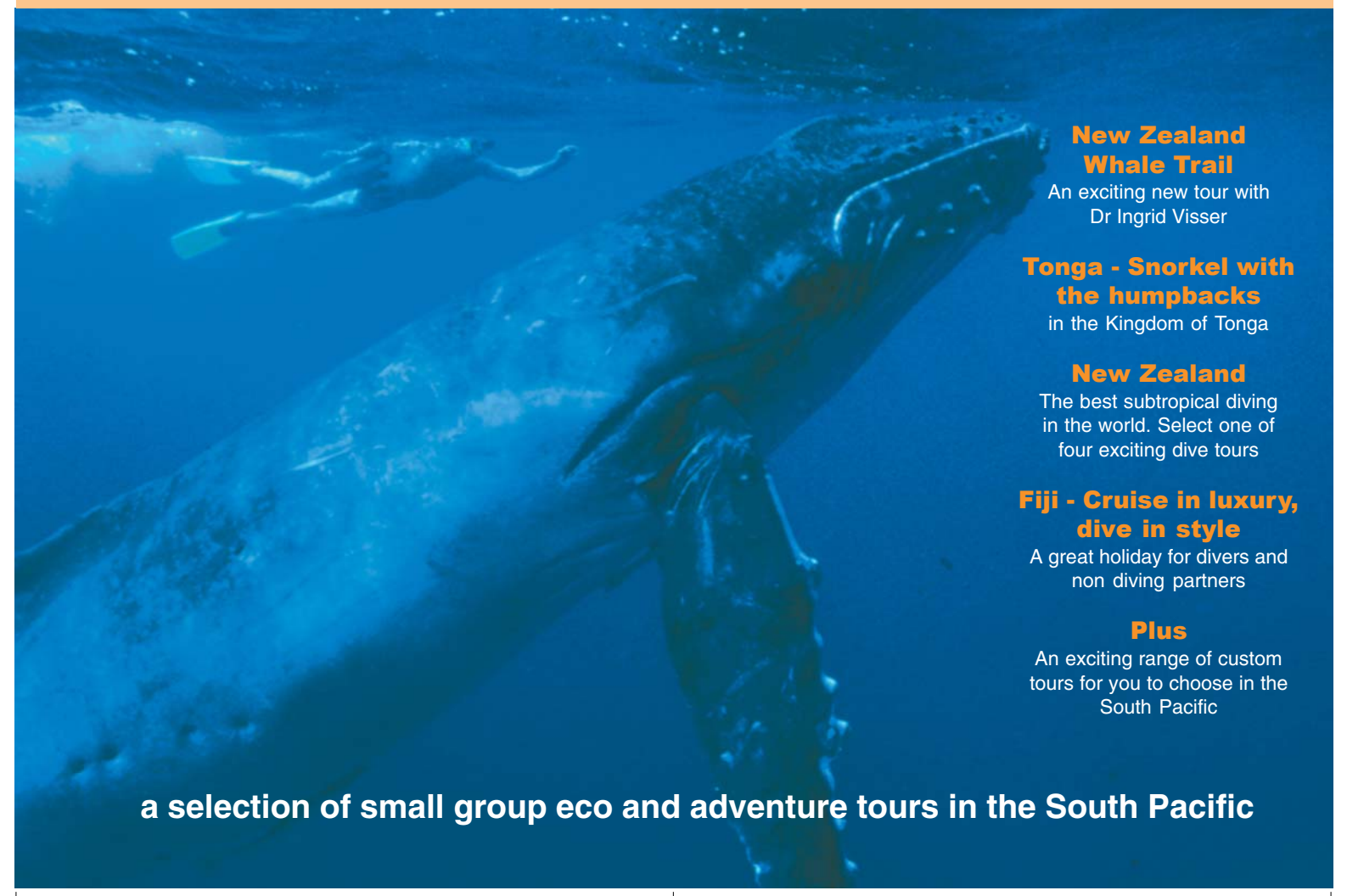

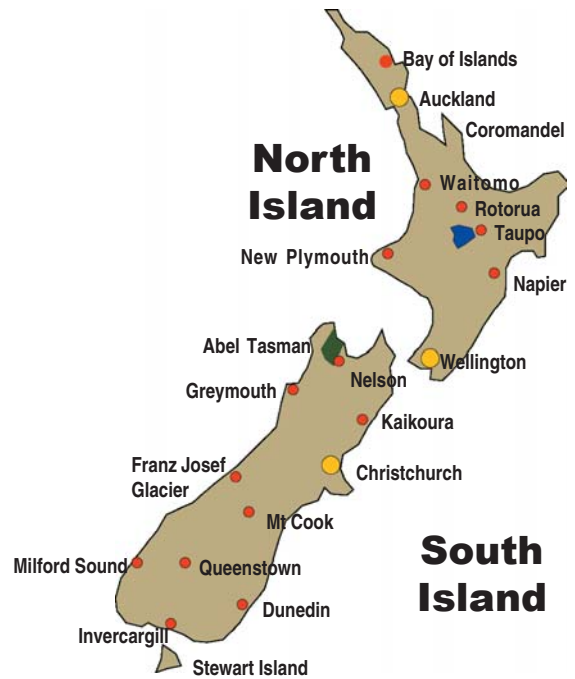

# Whale Trail 12-day New Zealand Tour



## Ever wanted to meet whales and dolphins in their own environment?

Here is your chance! Come and travel with us on an educational tour of marine mammal watching hotspots in New Zealand.

We have a chance of encountering ten species of cetaceans; humpback, Bryde's, Southern right, Minke, pilot and sperm whales, and bottlenose, common and Hector's dolphin as well as the world's largest dolphin (the orca) and two species of pinnipeds (the New Zealand fur seal and sealion).

With a strong emphasis on education and supporting research projects we will take you to meet marine mammals in their own world. Where possible we will enter the water and swim with these amazing creatures. You will be accompanied by Dr. Ingrid N Visser, a world expert on orca. We will also be joined by guest lecturers

and researchers at various locations around the country.

Learn how to save stranded whales and dolphins by completing a Marine Mammal Medic course, where you will have hands-on experience with the rescue equipment.

With our own digital photography and a hydrophone (underwater sound recording equipment), we will create your very own memento to take home and share with friends and family.

### Join Ingrid

Born in New Zealand, Ingrid has loved the marine environment since she was a small child. Researching whales and dolphins was always her dream, and after 10 years research she completed her Ph.D. on the New Zealand orca (killer whales). Since then her studies have taken her all around the world. Join Ingrid for the whale and dolphin trip of a lifetime. She will endeavour to get you up close and personal with a wide range of marine mammals and will introduce you to other researchers working with marine mammals. Ingrid will give you hints about how to photograph these stunning animals and provide insights about the species you are observing.

• **Marine Mammal Medic Course** • Learn about whale strandings and how you can assist in the event of a stranding. The course is held in the beautiful Bay of Islands and includes the use of specialised rescue equipment.

• **Marine Mammal Discovery tour and Dolphin Swim, Bay of Islands** • Bottlenose and common dolphin are usually encountered here but you may also see a variety of other species including orca (killer whales), Brydes, pilot, Minke, sei, humpback, and very rarely the Blue Whale.

• **White Island - an Active Volcano** • On the journey to the Island we hope to encounter common dolphins. Bryde's, pilot, sperm, humpback whales and occasionally orcas may be sighted in these waters. On the island we provide safety equipment and the supervision necessary when venturing this close to the pulse of the earth as we explore this unique terrain with its underwater thermal vents.

• **Rotorua - a Geothermal Wonderland** • Spouting geysers, bubbling mud, warm geothermal pools, hot springs and spas make our visit to this incredible thermal reserve a memorable one.

• **Wellington - Te Papa, the National Museum of New Zealand** • Home to one of the largest collections of marine mammal skeletons in the world. We will have a behind the scene's look with the resident scientist and specialist.

• **Marlborough Sounds** • We search with local marine biologists for five different species - bottlenose, dusky and Hector's dolphins, orca and New Zealand fur seals - before taking a guided walk on Motuara Island - one of New Zealand's very special wildlife reserves.

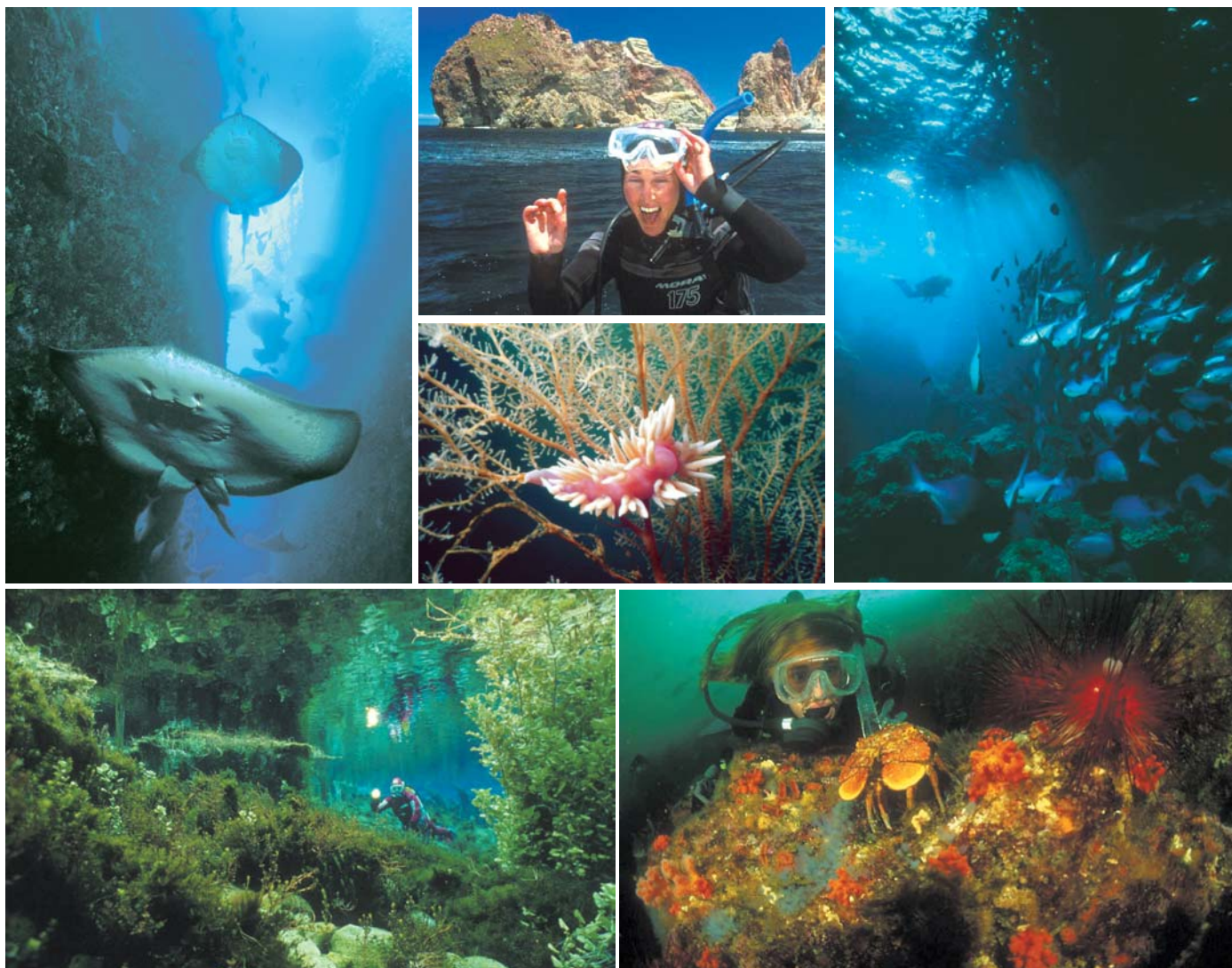
• **Whale Watching Kaikoura** • A world renowned opportunity for whale watching. From a helicopter you will view giant sperm whales and perhaps dolphins from above.

• **Seal or Dolphin Swim Kaikoura** • You will have the opportunity to swim with the seals or dolphins in this fantastic region. As well as the chance to view many of the birdlife varieties that find Kaikoura a haven, like the giant albatross and smaller albatross, cormorants, shearwaters, petrels and shags.

• **Akaroa - Dolphin Experience** • Experience a rich variety of marine life including the Hector's dolphin - found only in New Zealand waters - and the world's smallest penguin, the little blue. If you wish, you may have the opportunity to swim with these tiny rare dolphins. The seascape is dominated by towering volcanic cliffs teeming with marine birdlife.

We also offer a post-extension tour to the South Pacific island chain of the Kingdom of Tonga for the whale watching encounter of a lifetime. Enter the warm tropical waters and swim with humpback whales while feeling their songs vibrate through your body.

## A summary of New Zealand dive sites



Diving in New Zealand is an exceptional experience well known to the locals and just recently discovered by the international diver.

The country abounds with sub-tropical and temperate reefs, wrecks, clear water springs and alpine fiords. Vineyards and lodgings crisscross the country.

New Zealand lies midway between the equator and the South Pole. Its waters in the north are sub-tropical and temperate in the south.

Jacques Cousteau loved diving in New Zealand. He rated the Poor Knight Islands as one of the top dive sites in the world, and described Fiordland as an "underwater wonderland".

**First Light Travel** invites you on an experience you'll never want to end.

Without giving too much away, here's a glimpse of selected New Zealand dive sites...

**1. The Poor Knights** - undoubtedly the jewel in the crown of New Zealand diving. This subtropical reef system presents a stunning diversity of reef fish. Broken by caves, archways and fissures, they provide many different nooks and crannies for sea life over a wide range of depths.

**2. Waikoropupu Springs** - rated in the top ten freshwater diving destinations in the world. With amazing colours, it is like an underwater garden with rich growths of aquatic plant life everywhere. Scientists have recorded the horizontal visibility at 62 metres (203 feet).

**3. White Island** - an active volcano. This fascinating place offers exciting dives from pinnacles with 150 metre drop offs to cruisy reef dives. Underwater vents are a feature of this volcanic area. Fish life is extremely abundant.

**4. The Riwaka Resurgence** - an entry level freshwater cave dive with awesome stalagmite formations. The

highlight of the dive is the massive chamber at the end of sump two where a magnificent waterfall of pink limestone cascades 20 metres down one side.

**5. Kaikoura** - beholding a vast array of wonderful and unique marine creatures from the smallest invertebrate through to the giant sperm whales. Go diving with the dolphins and fur seals or watch the whales.

**6. Fiordland** – unique because of the light-absorbing fresh water layer which restricts algal growth and allows deep water or light avoiding species such as black coral, sandpaper fish and spiny sea dragons as well as approximately 160 other species of fish to become established in shallow water.

**7. The Mikhail Lermontov** – one of the few intact ship wrecks, this massive 170 metre, 20,000 tonne Soviet cruiseliner sunk in the Marlborough Sounds in 1986.

**8. HMNZS Waikato** - purposefully sunk in November 2000 and now lying at 30 metres, she has large holes

cut in the side making entry and exit very safe so less experienced divers will gain valuable wreck diving experience.

**9. HMNZS Tui** - designed for submarine hunting and spy work. At 62 metres long she now lies at 30 metres. Penetrate the wreck through purpose cut access and exit points, and explore the control room, bridge, crew living quarters and engine rooms via established routes.

**10. The Rainbow Warrior** – the Greenpeace flagship controversially bombed in Auckland Harbour by the French Secret Service in 1985. Relocated to the Cavalli Islands two years later, she is now a stunning artificial reef hosting masses of marine life.

**11. River drift diving** – an exhilarating experience. Watch as trout swim by while you fly along at eight to ten knots, aim for a boulder the size of a car, and at the last second zoom over the top.

## NEW ZEALAND DIVE TOURS



### Northern Highlights - 7 day small group tour

This tour is a must for anyone wanting to experience the best sub-tropical diving and snorkelling in the world. We combine diving at the magnificent Poor Knights Marine Reserve (considered by the late Jacques Cousteau to be among the 10 best dive locations in the world), with the infamous wreck of the Greenpeace ship the *Rainbow Warrior* and other great wreck dives, and plenty of above-water activities too.

There's plenty to do for divers and non-divers in this great 7-day tour, including kayaking and a 4x4 safari to Cape Reinga, the northern most tip of New Zealand where the green waters of the Tasman Sea meet the blue of the Pacific. This is a spiritual place, where the souls of the Maori deceased leave Aotearoa (New Zealand) and swim across the Pacific Ocean to Hawaii - the Polynesian spiritual homeland.

This subtropical excursion also presents endless opportunities for non diving partners.

#### Highlights:

- Diving the controversial former Greenpeace flagship - the *Rainbow Warrior* and the Bay of Islands.
- Diving and snorkelling the Poor Knights Marine Reserve.
- Diving the twin wrecks - the *HMNZS Tui* and *HMNZS Waikato*.
- A 4x4 safari and kayaking to lands end Cape Reinga.

### Central Discoverer - 7 day small group tour

There are very few places you can dive and explore an active volcano, such as White Island.

The variety offered in this tour includes a high velocity drift dive down the mighty Waikato river, soaking in a thermally heated beach, diving in a lush Coromandel marine reserve, an evening feast of traditional Maori foods whilst having aspects of Maori cultural traditions explained, and exploring the majestic Waitomo Caves - a lost world in the very heart of central New Zealand.

In addition the World Heritage Tongariro Crossing provides an opportunity to experience some of the most scenic volcanically active areas in New Zealand. Often described as the best one day walk in New Zealand, the Tongariro Crossing is a refreshing way to break our diving schedule.

New Zealand's Central Volcanic plateau makes for an exciting experience for diving or non divers alike.

#### Highlights:

- Dive or snorkel Cathedral Cove Marine Reserve.
- Dive the Aldermen Islands.
- Dive and climb White Island volcano.

## Southern Wonder - 7 day small group tour

The unspoilt scenery of New Zealand's South Island is the perfect setting for this dive and nature tour, as the discoveries in this region are spectacular and inspiring.

Surfacing inside two massive chambers within the mighty Riwaka Cave, a pink limestone waterfall dominates your view. Explore the underwater garden of Pupu Springs, the sacred Maori spring and home of the Taniwha (a legendary lizard-like creature). The Springs have a staggering 62 metre (203 feet) visibility. Descend on the 170 metre (558 feet) long *Mikhael Lermontov*, previously Russia's most luxurious cruise liner and one of the largest, most accessible diving wrecks of the modern era.

Combine these diving adventures with whale watching, seal diving, dolphin swimming, vineyard touring and kayaking through the stunning Abel Tasman National Park and you've got 7 days of South Island bliss.

This glimpse of the beautiful south has a great variety for divers and non-divers alike.

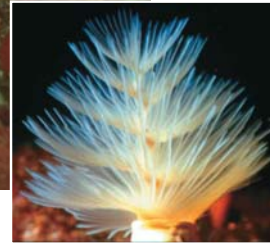

- Dive the wrecks of the *HMNZS Tui* or the *HMNZS Waitako*, now artificial reefs and home to extensive marine life.

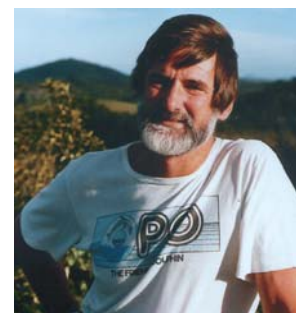

### Tonga - Swimming With Gentle Giants

Swim with the planet's most mysterious and magical marine giants. Imagine swimming close to a 35 ton, 14 metre (45 ft) long humpback whale and her newborn calf.

Approximately 450 South Pacific Humpback whales migrate to the beautiful islands of Tonga each year to breed and give birth to their calves in the warm sheltered waters. They migrate around 8,047 km (5,000 miles) from their feeding grounds in the Ross Sea, Antarctica, arriving in Tonga in late June - October each year.

The trip is intended to be educational and fun with a variety of talks and slideshows in the evenings, as well as informal learning on the boat.

From the sight of the first breach at dawn, to the silhouette of whales resting at sundown, these expeditions are a special and rare kind of ocean adventure in a particularly picturesque part of the world. It is no wonder the whales like it here.

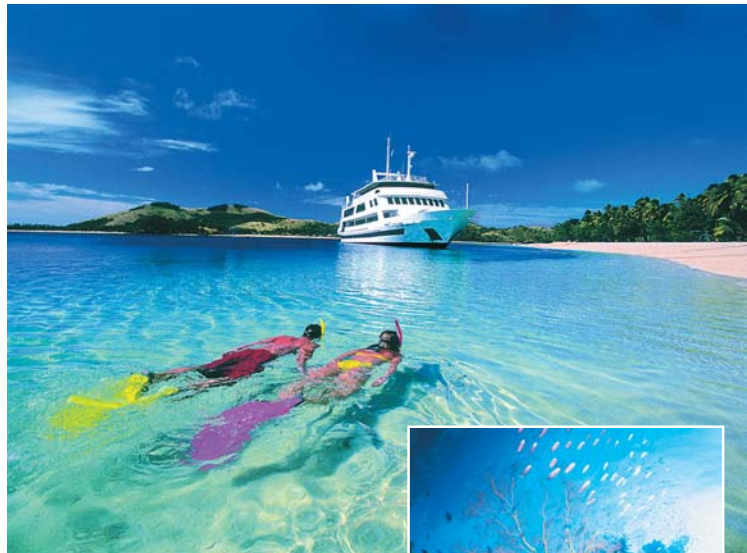

## Vanuatu - Andy Belcher's underwater photography workshop



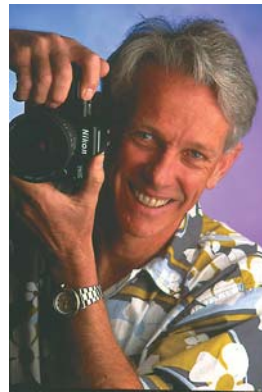
Join Andy Belcher, award winning underwater photographer, for one of his photography workshops on the beautiful Island of Vanuatu.

The Great Barrier Reef is the largest reef in the world measuring 2011 km (1256 miles) in length and 72 km (45 miles) across at its widest point. It is the world's largest marine protected area being approximately 348,700 sq km (217,937 sq miles) in area. The colossal size of the reef allows for a spectacular range of tropical holiday activities ranging from diving, sailing or just lounging in a resort soaking up the sun.

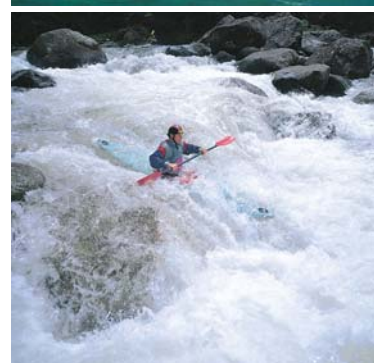
### Walking in New Zealand

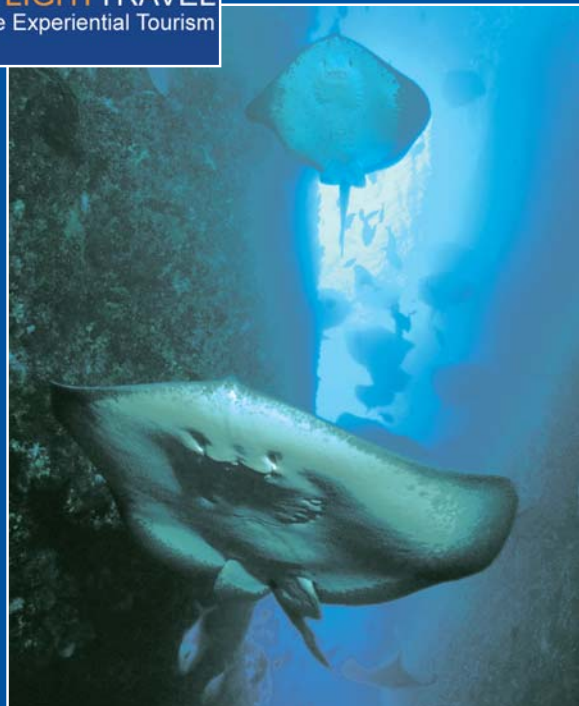
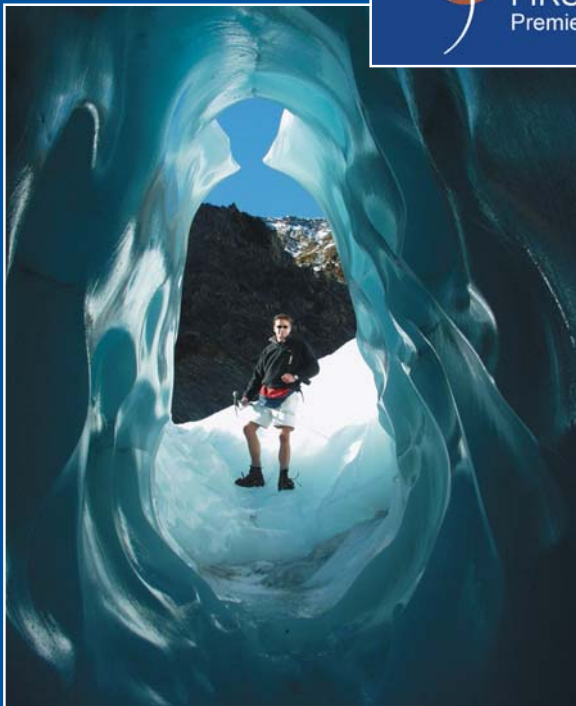
